#### 1. Capacity Building and Training Programs:

**Empowerment Initiative for Rural Women** and Adolescents (EIRWA) places a strong emphasis on capacity building for its staff. Through participation in local, regional, and national workshops, staff members are provided with opportunities to exchange ideas, share challenges, and strengthen collaborations. Engaging in these workshops ensures continuous learning, professional development, and the ability to enhance program effectiveness and strengthen collaborations with stakeholders. EIRWA's investment in staff capacity building is aimed at driving meaningful change and empowering women and adolescents in rural areas.

Throughout the year 2022, the organization conducted a range of capacity building and training programs tailored to meet the specific needs of its target beneficiaries.

These programs encompassed various topics, including leadership development, communication skills, financial literacy, and entrepreneurship training. Women and adolescent participants were provided with opportunities to develop their selfconfidence, decision-making abilities, and critical thinking skills.

#### 2. Economic Empowerment Initiatives:



Economic empowerment plays a crucial role in enabling women and adolescents to break free from the cycle of poverty and achieve financial independence. The Empowerment Initiative for Rural Women and Adolescents implemented several initiatives throughout 2022 to promote economic empowerment among its beneficiaries.

These initiatives included entrepreneurship training, business development support and access and income-generation projects. Women and adolescent participants were equipped with the skills necessary to start their own businesses, manage finances effectively, and how to access financial services.





## 3. Health and Well-being Programs: SRHR and Menstrual Hygiene Management Activities:

Recognizing the critical importance of health and well-being in the lives of women and adolescents, the Empowerment Initiative prioritized comprehensive health programs during 2022. The organization focused on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) education, aiming to equip women and adolescents with essential knowledge about their reproductive health, family planning, and the prevention of sexually transmitted infections.

In addition to SRHR activities, the organization also emphasized Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM). Recognizing the significant challenges faced by girls and women in rural areas in managing menstruation, the initiative conducted awareness campaigns, distributed sanitary pads, and provided education on proper menstrual hygiene practices. By addressing the taboo and stigma surrounding menstruation, the organization empowered girls to attend school regularly and pursue their education without hindrance.

### 4. School Girls Empowerment Program: 'Girls Can.'Empowerment Clubs:

The "Girls Can." aims to empower rural girls and young women in Zambia through enhanced access to sexual and reproductive health information, improved literacy skills, and digital literacy. The project seeks to improve health outcomes, expand educational opportunities, and foster overall empowerment for girls, enabling them to lead successful and fulfilling lives.

It is dedicated to ensuring equal educational opportunities and empowering girls to dream big and achieve their goals. Through its holistic approach, the program aims to empower girls with the tools they need to navigate challenges, seize opportunities, and make a positive impact in their lives and communities.

The program also facilitated access to role models and mentors who inspired and guided the girls in their personal and academic journeys. Through the "Girls Can! " project, our organisation seeks to address the specific challenges faced by rural girls, unlock their potential, and create pathways for them to thrive in all aspects of their lives.

To drive sustainable change and create an enabling environment for women and adolescents, the Empowerment Initiative conducted advocacy and awareness campaigns throughout the year. These campaigns aimed to challenge gender norms, raise awareness about women's rights, and advocate for policy changes to address gender inequalities.

The organization collaborated with local communities, government entities, and other stakeholders to promote dialogue, share knowledge, and foster a supportive ecosystem for women's empowerment. Through workshops, community events, and media engagements, the initiative amplified the voices of women and adolescents, encouraging them to become active participants in advocating for their rights.



## ACHIEVEMENTS

## Launched Girls Empowerment Clubs in 3 schools

Supporting and mentoring at least 1,00 school girls from 3 different schools through a school girls empowerment club.

## 200 girls trained "DIY Re-usable sanitary cloth pad making

Impacted over 200 girls in school through the 'Do It yourself' sanitary cloth pad-making project and distrubuted over 500 packets odf disposable sanitary pads.

## 4 advocacy and leadership Events

Reached out to 2,306 school girls from 15 schools with SRHR information, advocacy and leadership skills workshops, -challenging them to become advocates, leaders and change agents.

## 10 awareness campaigns and outreaches

Reached out to over 10 villages through focused group discussions, awareness campaigns and sensitization meetings on GBV, SRHR, women's issues and Women's rights.

## Created Safe spaces for women

Enabling women to openly share their stories, challenges, and successes, finding solace in the shared experiences of others. Women gain strength, inspiration, and a renewed sense of hope, knowing that they are not alone in their journey.

## 80 Women empowerment socially and economically

Trained 50 women in beehive construction, and beekeeping and supported them with 2 beehives each. Another 20 women were equipped with knowledge and skills in sustainable, climate-friendly agricultural practices and supported with 100kg of ground nuts seeds.


## **2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY**

- Strengthen monitoring and evaluation mechanisms to assess program impact and improve strategies based on evidence.
- Actively seek partnerships and engage in networks to leverage resources, share best practices, and contribute to collective efforts in empowering rural women and adolescents.
